In consultation with FHWA, PDPM Chapter 24 – Freeway Agreements was updated to remove the requirement for FHWA concurrence on changes to freeway agreements on Interstate routes.

PDPM Chapter 25 – Relinquishments was updated to:

- Cite California Streets and Highways Code Section 73.4 which became effective January 2023.
- Include a new type of relinquishment for infrastructural barrier.
- Change terminology from initial site assessment (ISA) to environmental disclosure memo (EDM) to be consistent with Division of Environmental Analysis guidance.
- Provide various minor language clarifications.
